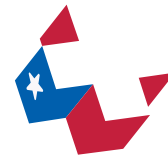

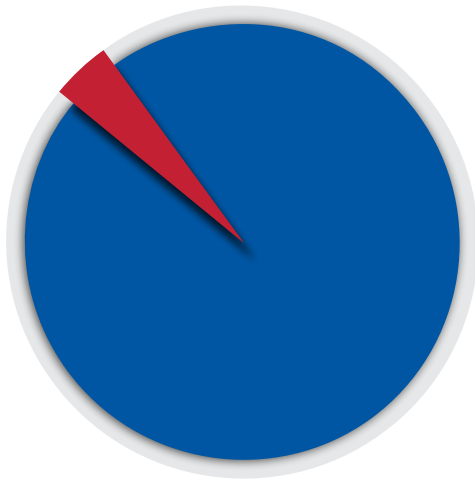

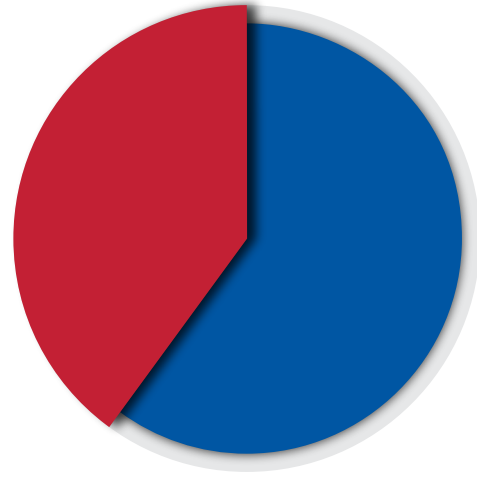
These hospitals anchor the state's trauma and disaster response infrastructure and deliver world-class tertiary and community-based care to patients in every one of Texas' 254 counties.

More than half have achieved Magnet® designation by the American Nurses Credentialing Center.

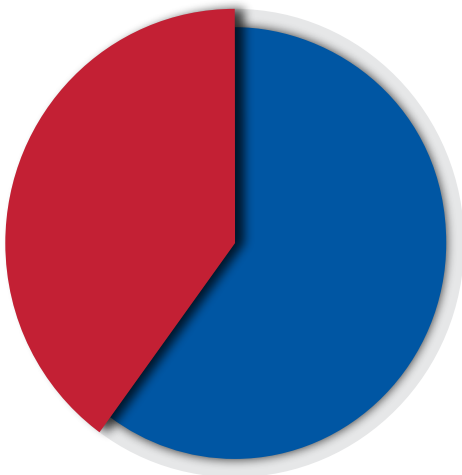
4% of Texas Hospitals



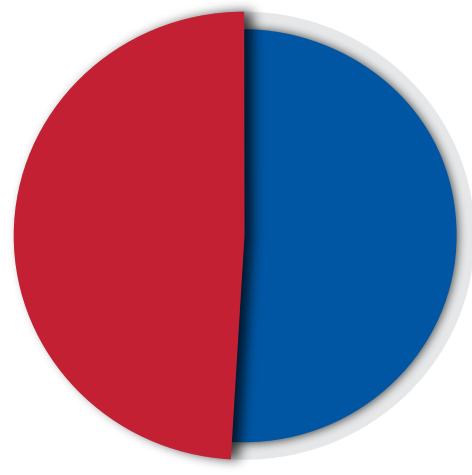
40% of State's Level 1 Trauma Centers

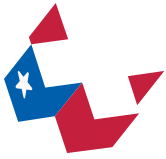


40% of Hospital-Reported Unfunded Charity Care

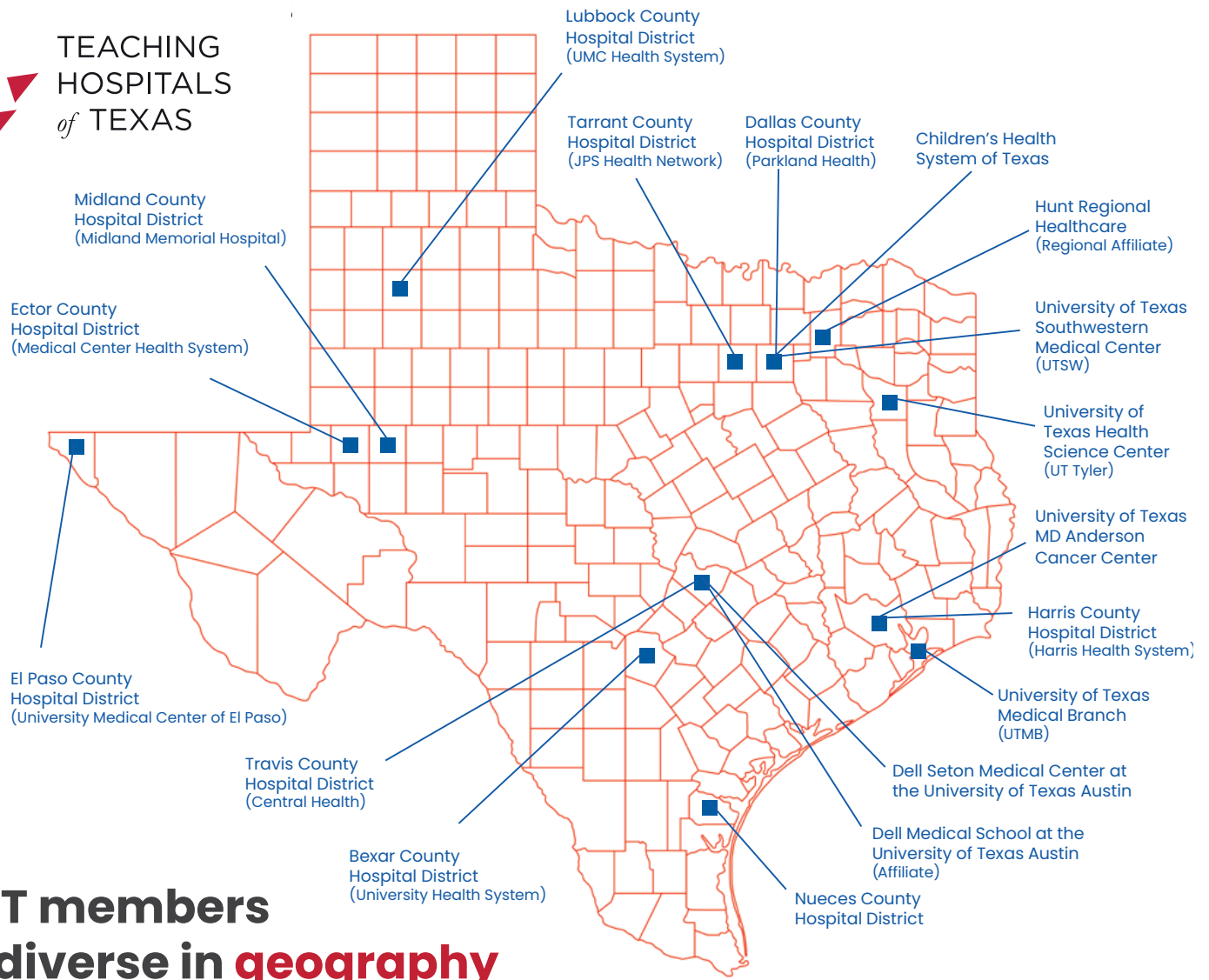


49% of State's GME Residents
