17% of licensed pharmacist FTEs

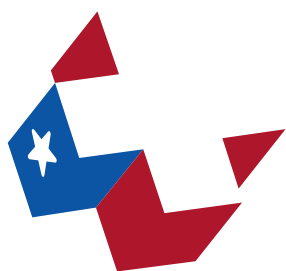
